The Saint Timothy School Council (CSAC) had a very rewarding year. The school council held seven meetings (September 27th, October 25th, November 29th, January 31st, February 28th, April 11th, and May 8th) and worked on various initiatives during the year. These meetings were open to the public to encourage input from parents and other members of the community to inform our discussions of the various issues considered. The purpose of the CSAC is to improve pupil achievement and to enhance the accountability of the education system to parents, through the active participation of parents. CSACs are advisory organizations. A CSAC's primary means of achieving its purpose is by making recommendations to the principal of the school and the school board. Boards and principals are responsible to consider recommendations made by each CSAC and advise the council(s) of the actions taken in response to the recommendations.

Initiatives and achievements of the school council in 2022 - 2023 included the following:

- Discussion and planning regarding an enclosed area for our kindergarten students. We also had 1. presentations and discussions regarding the primary creative playground.
- Reviewed Policies, WCDSB Plans and Memorandums: School Generated Funds, Inclement Weather 2. Policy, School Council, Multi-Year Strategic Plan and Pastoral Plan.
- Our Librarian Technician provided updates on the status of our Learning Commons. 3.
- School Travel Planning Facilitator STSWR joined our meetings and provided updates regarding school 4. travel planning.
- Updates were shared regarding our Safe, Caring and Inclusive School Team. We discussed general 5. concerns regarding the climate of the school.
- Other discussion items included projected enrolment, Umbrella Project, school improvement plan, staffing 6. changes and school wide activities.







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- Supported the celebration of Grade 8 graduation, Bible Ceremony, and anti-bullying initiatives. 7.
- 8. Parish updates were shared regarding mass and Sacrament preparations.
- School newswire referred to successful ventures by School Council (i.e., family carnival, purchases, etc.). 9.
- 10. EQAO and MDI survey (climate survey) information were shared and how this information will help make informed planning decisions.
- 11. Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion initiatives were shared regarding school policies and programs. Our school equity statement was crafted with input from council members.
- 12. Annual review regarding school dress code with council members.
- 13. Continued communication to parents by utilizing our school website, school messenger, twitter, and newswire.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank the parents of Saint Timothy School for all their fundraising efforts this past year. There were two primary fundraising events that occurred, and we raised approximately \$8 000.00 - Spook-a-thon and popcorn. We will be carrying over approximately \$18 000 towards next year's initiatives. We also raised approximately \$2 000 from our Family Carnival event which will be used to support families in our school community in need. Now, we would like to inform you of where your hard-earned fundraising dollars have been spent.
